Industry Placements

It is encouraged that students complete 100 hours of industry placement. This placement must be relevant to the content of the course. In the past, students have completed their placements in field such as:

- Education

- Health and Fitness
- Journalism and Media
- Recruitment
- Sports Management
- Statistics and Analysis

Why host a Student?

Responsibilities of the student

- Maintain Industry Placement Log and have it signed off by the Host Organisation regularly, and finalised by the end of the placement.

- Contact Richmond Institute's Placement & Pathways teams with any questions or to report any concerns immediately.

Responsibilities of the Host Organisation and Placement Supervisor

- Provide students with adequate training and assistance to carry out their role
- Provide student with appropriate supervisor and resources
- Involve the student in meaningful and enriching activities
- Offer guidance and regular feedback to the student
- Routinely approve the students Industry Placement Log and finalise by the end of the placement.
- Provide the student with a final evaluation at the end of the placement (discussion and evaluation form).
- Contact Richmond Institute's Placement & Pathways teams with any questions or to report any concerns immediately.
